Recommendation: Accept to writer's workshop

Rationale: Klaus has worked very hard on this paper. The initial draft focussed almost entirely on the solution with little consideration of the problem or forces. The shepherding has focussed on these aspects and he has thought about them well. I'm still in some doubt about whether the solution itself actually constitutes a pattern but I think the things he addresses in the solution almost certainly are. I don't think Klaus would get much from a writing workshop unless his mentor knew a lot about teaching and learning - he would be better off getting feedback from a group with members from very different backgrounds ... hence, a writer's workshop.
